Beth Holloway, President:

An Arkansas native, Beth Holloway is a graduate of the University of Arkansas in Little Rock, where she studied speech pathology. In 2005, her only daughter, Natalee, a high school senior, went missing on a class trip to Aruba. To this day, Natalee's case remains unsolved. Beth decided to dedicate her life to helping others with similar circumstances. Since her daughter's disappearance, Beth has become a motivational speaker, traveling around to schools, churches, law enforcement groups, and other organizations to spread awareness about travel safety. On October 2, 2007, Beth published *Loving Natalee: A Mother's Testament of Hope and Faith*, which describes Beth's experiences and obstacles she faced dealing with a missing child. Beth hopes that with her commitment and drive to educate others about travel safety, the number of missing person cases will decrease and families will not have to endure the same difficulties of missing a loved one. She is currently living with her son Matt in Birmingham, Alabama.
