Washington, D.C. Celebrates the First Year of Crime and Punishment

Washington, DC – On May 23, 2009, the **National Museum of Crime & Punishment** will celebrate its one-year anniversary. The first 75 guests will be granted free admission to the museum to mark the 75th Anniversary of Bonnie and Clyde’s death, which also falls on May 23rd. (The museum is home to the 1967 Hollywood film “Death Car” of Bonnie and Clyde as well as several other Bonnie and Clyde artifacts.)

To welcome the tourists and residents spending the Memorial Day weekend in Washington, D.C., the museum will offer a myriad of special events from Friday, May 22nd through Sunday, May 24th. “Our inaugural year has been extremely successful,” said Janine Vaccarello, Chief Operating Officer of the National Museum of Crime & Punishment. “We are looking forward to the upcoming year, especially as we introduce several new artifacts, temporary exhibits and three new CSI workshops.”
